We have a faculty member, Dr. Timothy Vail, who has been a host mentor for a graduate student and two undergraduate students from the University of Duisburg-Essen in Germany. The three students have conducted research under his direction on the environmental detection of endocrine disrupting compounds.

We have also hosted (8) visiting scholars from other universities: Dr. Ettore Mastrorilli (Universita di Pisa, Italy- 2000) and dr. Adel Amer (University of Alexandria, Egypt 2001, 2003).

Over the past 6-7 years, six international post-doctoral associates have worked in our department: Dr. Narayana Nagesh (India), Dr. Xuesen Fan (China), Dr. Nidhi Gupta (India), Dr. Longhu Zhou (China), Dr. Janeba Zlatko (Czech Republic), and Dr. Xinyang Zhang (China).

We have two faculty who have strong international ties. Dr. Rich Foust was a visiting Professor at Tabbin Institute for Metallurgical Studies, Cairo, Egypt (1992), and was a Fulbright Academic Specialist, University of Qatar, Doha, Qatar, (1994). Dr. Michael Ketterer has many international collaborators and has traveled extensively to work with collaborators and to present at seminars. He has traveled to Poland, Thailand, Italy, Germany, and Russia.

We have also had a few undergraduate Chemistry majors in the 1:2:1 Chinese program.
